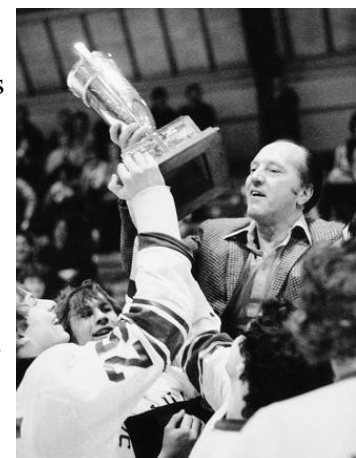

John Warchol
Nov. 8, 1934 - Feb. 17, 2022



John Warchol, one of the most respected and emulated hockey coaches in the state, passed away on Feb. 17, 2022 at the age of 87. John started his coaching career at Seton Halls in 1972 and was the coach there for 34 years. During his coaching career, at Seton Hall Prep he led the team to a record nine Gordon Cups and three state titles, and posted a 506-254-53 record. He was named The Star Ledger Coach of the Year in 1982 and was recog-

nized by the NJ Professional Hockey Writer's Association for his many contributions to youth hockey in the Garden State. In 1992, Warchol was inducted into the Seton Hall Prep Hall of Fame and in 1995-96 he was the recipient of the NJ Devils John McMullen Service Award for Hockey in NJ. An outstanding player in his own right, Warchol was a member of the 1963 US National Hockey team that competed throughout Europe. Warchol had officiated games for the Eastern College Athletic Conference as both a referee and linesman and had experience as a High School and youth official. John was a founding board member of the New Jersey Ice Hockey Hall of Fame and was inducted with the inaugural class in 2010. He helped shape the lives of many people and his influence on players and coaches during his decades of New Jersey hockey involvement has been integral to the growth of hockey in the state and he will be missed by many.

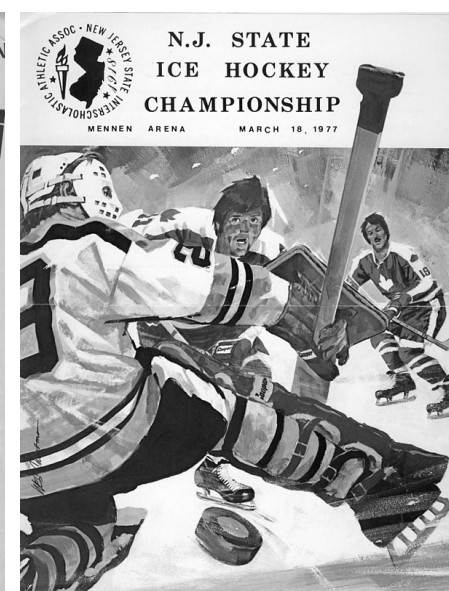
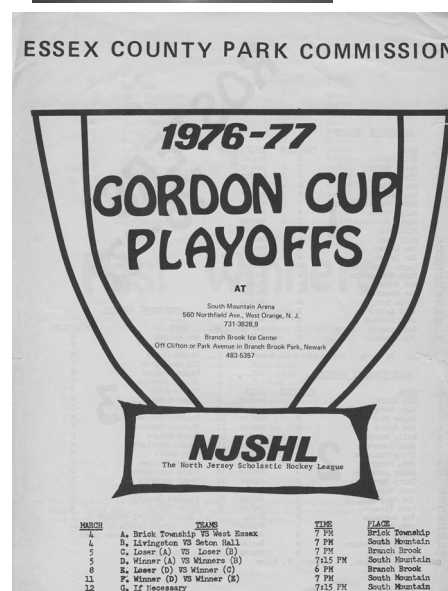

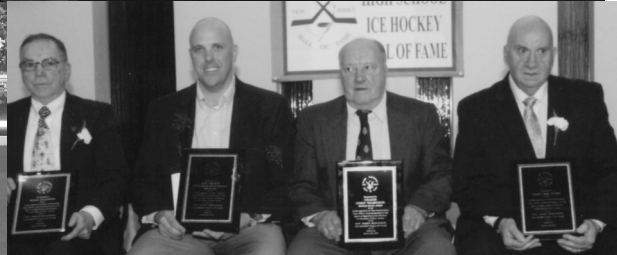

Steve's youth hockey started at age five at the Brick Hockey Club where he became a goalie at age six. He played his youth hockey for the Brick Hockey Club, Philadelphia Little Flyers and the New Jersey Junior Devils. During his youth career, his teams played in the USA Hockey Nationals three times, in 1984 (Pee Wee), 1986 (Bantam) and in 1990 (Junior).

Steve's high school career began in 1987 where he was the starting goaltender all four years.

- Toms River Board of Education Athletic Achievement Award (1989 & 1990)
- All Ocean County First Team Ice Hockey Goalie (1987, 1988, 1989, 1990)
- Toms River North Ice Hockey Team Most Valuable Player (1989 & 1990)
- Toms River North Ice Hockey Team Captain (1989 & 1990)
- Hockey Night In Boston Mid-Atlantic Team (1989)
- Hockey Night In Boston All Star Team, New York Mid-America (1989)

After high school, Steve took a post graduate year playing varsity ice hockey at South Kent School in South Kent, CT. He then went on to play varsity ice hockey at Williams College from 1991-1994. Steve graduated from Williams College *cum laude* with a Bachelors Degree in Economics and later attended DePaul Kellstadt Graduate School of Business with a Masters Degree in Accountancy. He later received his CPA credential and has enjoyed an over 25 year career in commercial real estate. He currently works at M&J Wilkow, a commercial real estate owner and operator in Chicago.

Starting every game his senior year, Sean recorded an 18-7-4 record with 7 shutouts and a 2.24 GAA on the way to the 2004 public school state championship for the West Essex Knights. One of the biggest highlights of the season was a 1-0 victory over then ranked #1 St. Peters Prep. Sean was part of a group of senior starters that had played together for most of their high school careers,

and many played for the Montclair Blues Midget team. Sean went on to play 3 years of Club hockey at Villanova University and continues to play Adult League hockey in his spare time. He and his wife recently got married and currently live in Charleston South Carolina. He will always cherish the incredible experience of the 2004 championship run and all of the amazing memories created between he and his teammates.

Corey started his hockey career at age four. By six, he was a full-time goaltender. Corey played in several local rinks growing up, most notably Ice World, South Mountain Arena and Mennen Arena. He played for Rockaway Township, the North Stars, the Essex County Chiefs, and the Morris County Colonials. Corey was a four year Varsity letterman (1991-1995) at Morris Knolls High

School. Under Head Coach John Kovacs's tutelage, Corey continued to hone his craft, focusing on the physical and mental aspects of the position. Corey finished his career at Morris Knolls with over 1,500 saves. That total included stopping all five shootout attempts in an overtime victory against Pingry in the Mennen Cup. In his senior year, Corey earned All State honors, Morris County High School Hockey League MVP and Sportsmanship Award. He was also Morris Knolls co-male athlete of the year. Corey then attended Choate Rosemary Hall prep school for a post-graduate year. He was the starting goalie for Choate during the 1995-1996 season and was recruited by West Point. Corey was a four year Varsity letterman (1996-2000) at Army. In his senior year, Corey made 54 saves in a 1-0 overtime loss to UMass-Amherst. Corey finished his career at Army with a 2.97 goals against average. Corey served in the Army from 2000-2005 as a Field Artillery officer, earning a bronze star for exceptionally meritorious service in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Corey is currently an in-house attorney at LPL Financial. He lives in Walpole, Massachusetts with his wife, Lori and their two children, Ben and Izzy.

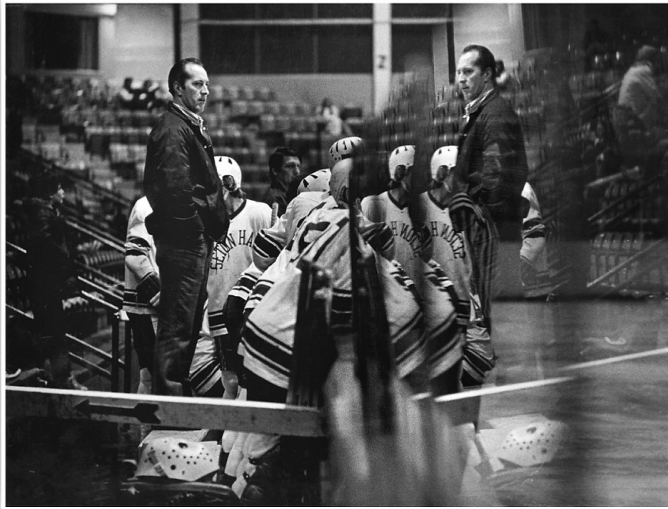

A member of the Montclair High School graduating class of 1987, He played four years of Varsity Hockey as a defenseman for the Montclair Mounties. The Montclair Mounties were a longstanding recipient of the League Sportsmanship Award and the importance of sportsmanship was a guiding principle for The Mounties. The combination of Bruce Parker as head

coach and Tom Clifford as assistant coach provided the natural leadership and discipline that enabled the team's success. Many of the members of the team played pond and street hockey together as children and they built upon that history in creating a cohesive team that became the reigning Montclair Mounties of 1987-88. In 1987 Maarty was named captain and the team amassed a record of 22-4-2 and won the Gordon Cup and the NJ HS Hockey State Championship title. In his Junior and Seniors he received the All State Team designation and represented a Select New Jersey Team at the US High School Invitational Hockey Tournament. At a collegiate level, Maarty Stadlander played defense for the St. Michael's College Purple Knights with a two year ECAC career of 4 goals 18 assists.



Alex Velischek

Defenseman

Born in Quebec City, Quebec, Alex Velischek was a 4-year Varsity Player at the Delbarton School where his team won 3 NJSIAA State Championships and 3 Gordon Cup Championships. He finished his Delbarton career with 121 Points in 94 Games and was drafted by the Pittsburgh Penguins 123rd Overall in the 2009 NHL Entry Draft. Velischek went on to play 4 years of NCAA Division I Hockey for Providence College in the

Hockey East Conference leading the Friars to the Hockey East Semifinals his senior season. He then spent the next 3 seasons playing professionally for several minor league teams including Wilkes-Barre Scranton Penguins (AHL), Wheeling Nailers (ECHL), Cincinnati Cyclones (ECHL), Missouri Mavericks (ECHL) and the Arizona Sun Dogs (CHL). He is now happily married living with his wife Catherine in Montclair, NJ and has been coaching in North Jersey for 9 years.

Toms River South (2009-10)



The 2009-10 Toms River South Ice Hockey team finished their season with a 25-2-2 record and a State Championship trophy. The Indians had their most successful regular season ever which resulted in a Christmas Tournament win, a regular season Division Title, and a Conference Championship (Dowd Cup). However, at the cutoff date for the seeding committee meeting, the Indians' strength of schedule failed to impress the seeding committee for the State Tournament and they were seeded 16th for the Public A Tournament. Determined to prove themselves, they opened with a 4-1 win over #17 Roxbury and second round 3-1 win against #1 ranked Morris Knolls, who had not lost to a public school all season. Continuing to pull off upset after upset with a 5-3 win over #8 Morristown in the quarterfinals, and a 4-3 victory over #4 Brick Memorial in the semifinals. On the biggest stage in NJ HS hockey, the Indians completed their miraculous run through the State Tournament with a 2-1 win over defending State Champion Randolph, the #3 seed. Despite being outshot 47-10, the Indians again found a way to overcome another tremendously talented opponent and win its first ever State Championship. In doing so, they became the lowest seeded team to ever win a state championship in NJ, in any sport.

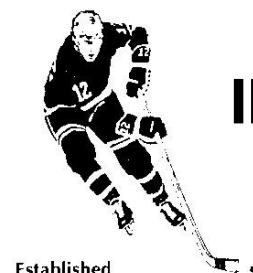

Cindy Acropolis (Toye) played for the Brick Township High School Varsity team from 1992 to 1996 for her grandfather and NJ HS HOF coach, Bob Auriemma. The Dragons competed in the Gordon Conference, and in 1996, the Brick Dragons won the New Jersey Public School State Championship for the first time since 1990. Acropolis's personal high school accolades include being the first female to play for BTHS and to compete and score a goal in the Gordon Conference, the first female to score a goal in a NJ State playoff game and the first female to win a Public School State Championship. In 86 games, Cindy tallied 15 goals and had 33 assists. Her sophomore year, Cindy qualified for the USA Olympic Training Camp in Lake Placid for the first ever USA women's ice hockey Olympic team. Cindy was inducted into the Brick Township High School Wall of Fame in 2017. Cindy went on to play women's college hockey at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) in Troy, NY from 1996-2000. She still holds nearly every single season and career offensive record, scoring 128 goals and 84 assists in 128 games. Cindy was named ECAC Rookie of the Year and to the All-ECAC First Team. She was also a three-time National All-America Second Team selection and four-time Most Valuable Player. Cindy was inducted into the RPI Athletic Hall of Fame in 2010. Cindy has been coaching youth hockey from Mite to Midgets for 13 years. Two teams Cindy coached qualified for USA Hockey Nationals. She currently coaches the NJ Titans 19UAAA girls team. Cindy resides in Brick with her husband, Kevin, and three kids, Kiley (19), Kevin (17) and Jacob (16). Cindy's daughter, Kiley, will be following in her mom's footsteps playing hockey for RPI next season.

Mark's ice hockey career began at age 5 in 1961 at the Asbury Park Casino Arena. He continued playing youth hockey at Navesink and Brick Hockey Club until 1971. His hockey crazed parents, particularly his Montreal native mother packed the belongings from their Interlaken, NJ home and relocated to Brick, NJ where Mark continued his hockey career at Brick Township High School for three seasons until 1974. Mark was voted all state honorable mention in his first two seasons. In the 1973-74 season which was Mark's final year of high school his game had vastly improved. At seasons end the New Jersey Inter-scholastic Hockey League coaches would vote Mark the winner of the William Halverson Trophy as the league's Most Valuable Player. He was also the league's leading scorer and was a first team all star. His Brick team won its first ever A Division regular season title and first ever Gordon Cup Championship. In 1974 Mark was named Asbury Park Press Athlete of the week and in 2000 Mark was named to the Newark Ledger All Century 1970's All Decade Team. Mark then played at ECAC Division II St. Anselms College, Manchester, N.H. during the 1974-75 and 1975-76 seasons. He then transferred closer to home to Fairleigh Dickinson University. From 1976-77 through 1978-79 he led the Metropolitan Collegiate Hockey Conference in scoring and was a first team all-star. In 1976-77 his FDU team won its first ever MCHC regular season and playoff championship. After college graduation Mark went to law school in San Diego, Ca. where he connected with the president of the newly formed San Diego Adult Hockey league. Due to the immediate need for league referees his focus changed as he became a self taught referee for the league. This provided some needed regular income to a broke law school student. Upon returning to New Jersey in 1982 he became a USA Hockey and National Ice Hockey Officials registered certified referee. From 1984 to 2000 Mark was the president of the Jersey Shore Ice Hockey Officials Association and a referee assignor for both USA Hockey and NIHOA. In 1996 Mark was voted by his peers as the National Federation of High Schools Ice Hockey Referee of the Year. In 1997 Mark attended a USA Hockey referee instructor and power skating program in Lake Placid, N.Y. on the invite of Tony Mariconda, the program supervisor. While there Mark presented a lecture to the attendees on the subjects of referee risk management and liability. Mark also regularly instructed at USA hockey seminars. He and his good friend Fred "Butch" Porrino, partnered for five years organizing and operating USA Hockey seminars in Atlantic City, N.J. Mark's referee career endured for 38 years from 1979 to 2017 when he stepped away for medical reasons.

Yardley covered high school ice hockey in New Jersey for more than 20 years, from 1996-2019, most notably through his website, NJHockey.org. A Morristown resident, Yardley's involvement started as an eighth-grader, when he began writing and editing his own weekly newsletter covering Morris County and distributed free copies at Mennen Arena throughout his high-school years. He was part of two Mennen Cup championship teams (2000, 2001) as a student manager at Delbarton. While in college at Rice University in Texas, he began publishing state-wide standings and created the website NJHockey.org. A go-to source for the entire hockey community, with no subscription requirement or paywall, the site listed every game of the season and impacted how teams built their schedules, fans understood regular-season standings, and administrators conducted state-tournament seeding. Equivalent coverage of girls' hockey began in 2017-18 as the number of New Jersey schools participating increased. Yardley wrote for Hockey Night in Boston from 2006-16, covering the state's most notable stories and often successfully making a case for New Jersey teams to be ranked in New England's top 20, including multiple No. 1 rankings. Yardley has worked as a play-by-play announcer for ESPN, Major League Soccer, and others, and lives with his family in New York City.

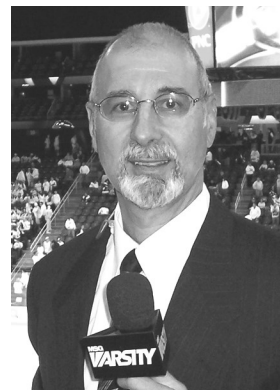


Lee Jelenic

Lee Jelenic was born in Toronto, Ontario and began his hockey career in Houston Texas, before relocating with his family to the Garden State at the age of 9. From 1989 to 1997 He played his NJ Travel Hockey for the Princeton Junior Tigers, Philadelphia Little Flyers, Mercer Chiefs and NJ Rockets. His NJHSH career spanned four seasons from 1993 – 1997 where he starred for West Windsor Plainsboro High School. He was also an all-conference baseball player recruited by various Division I baseball programs. In hockey, Jelenic amassed 228 points, 146 of them goals in 79 career games at West Windsor. His 1995-96 West Windsor team was the first Colonial Valley Conference team to make it past the second round of the NJ HS State hockey tournament, with Jelenic scoring the game winning goal in a 2-1 win over Hanover Regional at Mennen Arena. His team lost 4-0 in the third round of the state tournament to fellow NJHSHOF 2022 inductee Cindy Acropolis' Brick High School. Jelenic led New Jersey in goals in the 1996-97 campaign, his senior year. The August before Jelenic's senior year of High School, The Plymouth (MI) Whalers of the OHL invited him to their training camp. He spent the maximum 48 hours in camp, without forfeiting his NCAA eligibility. During his four years at WWPBS, Jelenic, was often told by junior, college, and pro scouts that if he stayed in NJ, rather than leave for prep school or the USHL he wouldn't be able to play Division I college hockey. Jelenic never left, and in 1997 became only the second male player in NJ High School Hockey History (Jim Dowd was the first) to go directly from a public NJ High School Hockey team to an NCAA Division I program, when he matriculated to Yale. Jelenic played four seasons at Yale, earning a varsity letter for three of those seasons. In his time at Yale, his team won one ECAC title, made one NCAA Tournament Appearance, and won three Ivy League Championships. Jelenic scored 5 goals and 10 assists in 75 career games at Yale, playing mostly as a checking line forward. He was also named to various ECAC AllAcademic Teams. He was also recognized in his senior year at Yale as the Yale Community Outreach Award Recipient for all of his efforts to bring the community of New Haven and Yale Athletics together. In 2001, after graduating from Yale with a degree in Political Science, Jelenic turned pro, signing with the Missouri River Otters of the United Hockey League (UHL). He was traded to the Flint Generals (UHL) early in the season and amasses 10G and 10A, along with 142 Penalty Minutes in his rookie pro season. He was named the Flint Generals Rookie of the year in 2002. His second campaign in Flint, in 2002, was even more successful, where Jelenic racked up 13G and 12A in 39 games, with 109 PIMs, before being signed by the Rochester Americans in the American Hockey League (AHL). Rochester is the AHL affiliate of the Buffalo Sabres (NHL). Jelenic's career came to an abrupt end after playing 17 games in the AHL due to degenerative cartilage in his right knee. After hockey he spent time at JP Morgan, Ford Motor Company, and is now the Chief Innovation Officer at United Wholesale Mortgage, the nation's second largest mortgage lender. He received an MBA with Honors from The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania in 2009). He currently resides in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan with his wife Anne and their six children. He also serves as the Head Coach of the '08 AAA Victory Honda Bantam Major team.

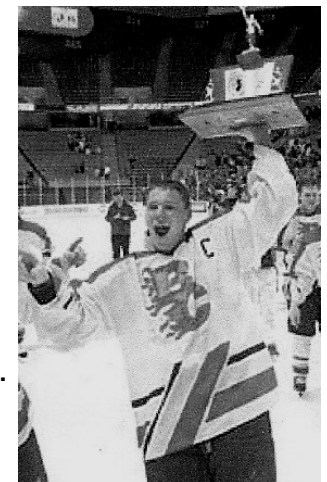

Dave (Davey) Sloan's impact on the NJ High School Hockey Community is multifold, genuine and storied. He is one of the original members of NIHOA (circa 1964) and officiated for over 25 years. He did numerous Gordon Cup finals and state finals. As a Coach, he coached with the Rockets, the Golden Blades and brought notoriety to the Upsala College Hockey Program, making it only the second college in NJ to reach NCAA status. His pedigree is the long list of successful players he developed, referees he molded, players he influenced and his overall love for the sport of ice hockey. He is greatly missed by all who knew him.

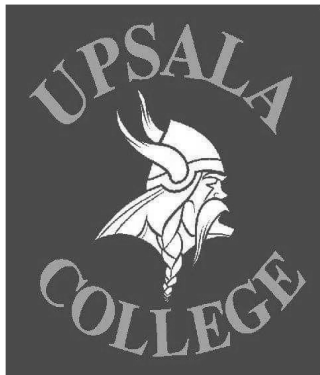

Cory Robinson grew up in Brooklyn, New York playing hockey for the Greater New York Stars before he moved on to play in Long Island with the Skateland Arrows. He played high school hockey for Xaverian High School helping lead the team as their starting goalie to their 1st NY City Championship in 1985. In 1990 he would be the first hockey player inducted into the Xaverian High School Hall of Fame.

He continued his college career at St. Johns University under the legendary coach Buzz DeChamps from 1985 to 1989. He began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at his Alma Mater Xaverian High School. In 1990 he would accept an Assistant Coaching position at Hudson Catholic High School where he would work under his cousin and coaching mentor Peter Jerabeck. In 1991 he would be promoted to the head coaching position at Hudson Catholic. During his tenure, he was selected as Star Ledger Coach of the year in 1999. During his time there he would be assisted by Frank McGady and Dave Metcalfe coaching the Hawks for 10 seasons helping lead the program to 3 division titles, 3 Cup Championships and the Parochial and State Championship in 2000. In 2003 he took over coaching at Fair Lawn High School helping lead the team to three division titles and a Cup Championship. During his time at Fair Lawn he was selected Bergen County Ice Hockey Coach of the Year. Also in 2003 he was appointed Director of Youth Hockey for the Town of Secaucus which is a position he still holds. In 2006 he left coaching high school hockey to take over as the Athletic Director at Fair Lawn High School. Additionally he currently holds the position as hockey liaison for the Big North Conference and also serves as the Tournament Director for the Bergen County, Big North and NJSIAA State Tournaments. Cory lives in Secaucus with his number one supporter and wife Colette and his children Richard (19), Cory (16) and Brody (11) who also share his passion for the sport. Special thanks to my parents, family, coaches and players who made my career so memorable and this accomplishment possible.

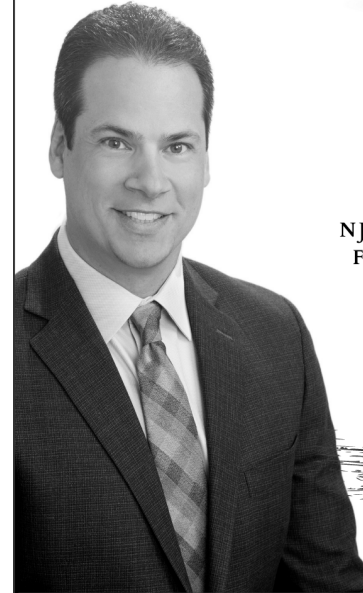

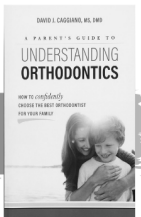
